NEW PROGRAMS

The 2013-14 school year will have two additional programs that will help prepare students for success beyond high school.

- Early College Learning Program: high school students will travel to Central Virginia Community College and can earn their Associates Degree from CVCC while also earning their high school diploma.
- XLR8—Governor's STEM Academy: a regional program that allows students to be better prepared for careers in the growing Science. Technology, Engineering and Math fields.

HHS UPDATE

A Heritage High School design workshop was held for three days. The workshop team included:

16 HHS staff members, three HHS students, three HHS parents, community members, city staff, two school board members, three Central Virginia Governor's School for Science and Technology Staff members, the Assistant Superintendents of Operations and Administration/Curriculum and Instruction, the Directors of Secondary Education, Special Education, Facilities and Maintenance, Transportation, Information Technology, Testing, Gifted and Guidance, and School Nutrition, and the Supervisor of Instruction for Career Tech.

During the April 9, 2013 school board meeting, the architects provided an overview of the designs that resulted from the three-day workshop and how they came to their final design decisions. Also, on April 23, 2013, the school board further discussed and approved the design with the addition of the indoor track. The design approved during this meeting was the one presented on May 14, 2013 to City Council.
