F-1. Capital Improvement Plan

Upon MOTION Dr. Nilles, SECONDED by Mr. Harvey, the school board approved the FY20 capital improvement plan which included \$1,000,000 in additional funding for the construction of new elementary school gymnasiums. School administration presented information at the August 6, 2019 board meeting regarding the project and the proposed addition of a gymnasium at Perrymont Elementary School.

G-2. Lynchburg City School Board Policy Updates

Several policy revisions were recently received from the Virginia School Boards Association (VSBA). G-3. Turing Point Academy

Upon MOTION Dr. Coleman, SECONDED by Dr. Nilles, the school board approved the 2019-2020 funding for the Lynchburg Regional Juvenile Detention Center Education Program, known as Turning Point Academy, in the amount of \$834,113.00. Lynchburg City Schools serves as the fiscal agent for this state-operated program. Lynchburg City Schools employs eight teachers, a principal, and a full-time administrative secretary with Lynchburg Regional Juvenile Detention Center where educational services are provided to approximately 48 students. The summary on the attachment outlines expenditures for the 2019-2020 school year. The Lynchburg Regional Juvenile Detention Center Education Program's funding has also been approved by the Virginia Department of Education.
