This program ensures that all students start the year with the tools to be successful in the classroom and provides teachers with supplies they need for their classrooms and for their students. Thanks to the generous support of grants and monetary dona-

tions along with materials donated from school supply drives, overstocks from local businesses, and upcycling of new and gently used supplies from the community and our own schools, our dedicated team of volunteers makes sure these supplies are distributed to the teachers and students who need them. LCS educators shop for FREE in-person on specified days or order with our on-line tool anytime. In 2022-2023, we supported 1,011 teacher visits and supplied 590 backpacks and 1,074 sets of school supplies to students in need through their school counselors.

Al Stroobants Foundation Grant

A \$50,000 grant from The AI Stroobants Foundation provided 2 years of funding for Classroom Innovation Grants, capital for the Lynchburg Imagination Library, as well as generous funding for Back to School Supplies and the Tools4Schools Warehouse. Stroobants dollars also provided a scholarship for Elijah 'Yink' Reid, a 2023 graduate of the Empowerment Academy, to attend an accredited vocational school and become a professional barber.





Excellence In Science Scholarship

This \$25,000 scholarship was awarded to Sage Khurana, who was dually enrolled in the Early College Program, graduating from E.C. Glass High School and Central Virginia Community College in May 2023. Sage is continuing his education at the College of William & Mary, where he is studying Biology and Geology to pursue his interest in ecology and the way organisms interact with their environment.

For the past 5 years this hallmark scholarship has been funded by BWX Technologies, Inc., DTE Energy Foundation, Framatome, Mr. & Mrs. Lee Ainslie, Jr., Dr. & Mrs. David Frantz, and Dr. and Mrs. Charles Pryor.

International Paper Grant

A \$5,000 grant from International Paper funded a Classroom Innovation Grant for the ROAR Center at the Turning Point Academy. Teachers Zhakia Scott, Olivia Johnson, and Lynn Halsey wanted to provide a makerspace where their students could cultivate deeper learning and take ownership of their education by doing and creating. Computer lab stations and a mobile kitchen are just two of the ways this grant is making this dream a reality for these students.
