Some of the scholarships require you to apply online, and **some applications can be picked up in the guidance office (as they become available)**. Also be mindful of the dates and deadlines for each scholarship you are interested in applying for, and turn in the application for review several days before submission.(unless application is online). Financial aid information can be accessed on the internet through many different sources. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**known as the FAFSA form**) can be filed over the internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Filing the FAFSA form is a student's first step in determining eligibility for government loans and grants. I encourage you to go to **Beacon of Hope** for more information. Students should also check out scholarships online, at their local churches and clubs, parents' places of employment, parents' civic organizations, etc. In addition, consult the individual colleges to which you have applied for financial aid and scholarships available only to that particular college.
