- Individual can return to school after 10 days since first positive COVID-19 test, IF they have NOT subsequently developed symptoms since their positive diagnosis; OR A healthcare practitioner's notice to return to work in accordance with school district office of education policy allowing employee to return to work

### Response

- Immediately notify the Director.
- The Director will notify a LAUREL nurse, the Regional Superintendent and other division representatives as needed.
- Local Health Departments will be contacted, the procedures and recommendations will be instituted
- If the individual has a <u>negative</u>
   COVID-19 test, they can return to
   school once there is NO fever
   without the use of fever reducing
   medications AND they have felt
   well for 24 hours
- If the individual has a <u>positive</u>
   COVID-19 test OR diagnosed with
   COVID-19 based on <u>symptoms</u> OR
   has not been tested BUT <u>has had</u>
   symptoms they can return to
   school when:
  - At least 72 hours have passed since recovery (defined as resolution of fever without the the use of fever reducing medications); AND
  - Improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g. cough, shortness of breath, etc); AND
  - At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared; OR A healthcare practitioner's notice to return to work in

accordance with school district office of education policy allowing employee to return to work
