

LAUREL Guidelines For Student Positive Screening Protocol While On Campus

<p style="text-align: center;">Exposure, No Symptoms</p> <p>Student shares they were exposed to someone with COVID-19 within last 2 weeks and does NOT symptoms</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Diagnosis, No Symptoms</p> <p>Student shares they were “diagnosed” with COVID-19 less than 10 days ago, but does NOT have symptoms</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Symptoms</p> <p>Student has at least 1 of the following COVID-19 symptoms: Fever, Chills, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, New cough, New loss of taste/smell</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Action</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Remain in current location ● Require appropriate face covering for the student ● Increase students’ social distance from others- ensuring student remains under visual supervision ● Call for nurse to assess student ● Nurse enacts plan to send student home ● Can return to school once it has been 14 days since exposure and they have NOT developed symptoms <p>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/hcp/disposition-in-home-patients.html</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Action</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Remain in current location ● Require appropriate face covering of everyone in immediate area ● Increase social distance of others in immediate area- ensuring student remains under visual supervision, provide support ● Call for nurse to assess student ● Nurse enacts plan to send student home ● Close off areas used by the sick student ● Wait at least 24 hours, then clean and disinfect area with an EPA registered product ● Can return to school after at least 10 days since first positive COVID-19 test, IF they have NOT subsequently developed symptoms since their positive diagnosis; OR a healthcare practitioner’s notice to return school in accordance with school district office of education policy 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Action</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Remain in current location ● Require appropriate face covering for the ill student (if tolerated) and of everyone in that location ● Increase social distance of all others in the location- ensuring the sick student remains under visual supervision, providing emergency support if necessary (<u>NOTE: if shortness of breath, bluish lips, difficulty breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, inability to stay awake is observed Call 911 to respond immediately!</u>) ● Call for nurse to assess student ● Nurse enacts plan to send student home, if no observed signs of distress as listed above in red ● Close off and ventilate facility areas used by the sick student ● Wait at least 24 hours, then clean and disinfect those areas with an EPA registered product

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	<p>allowing student return to school</p> <p>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/hcp/disposition-in-home-patients.html</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● If a student has a <i>negative</i> COVID-19 test, they can return to school once there is NO fever without the use of fever reducing medications AND they have felt well for 24 hours ● If a student has a <i>positive</i> COVID-19 test OR diagnosed with COVID-19 based on <i>symptoms</i> OR has not been tested BUT <i>has had symptoms</i> - they can return to school when: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - At least 72 hours have passed since recovery (defined as resolution of <i>fever</i> <u>without</u> the the use of fever reducing medications); AND - Improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g. cough, shortness of breath, etc); AND - At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared; OR a healthcare to school in accordance with school district office of education policy allowing student return to school <p>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/hcp/disposition-in-home-patients.html</p> <p>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html#seek-medical-attention</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nurse enacts plan to safely send student home as quickly as possible • Nurse notifies the Director. • Director notifies the Regional Superintendent and other division representatives as needed. • Nurse and Director will contact the Local Health Departments (Lynchburg as well as the county the student is a resident of and institute any recommended procedures) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nurse accompanies student (wearing cloth face covering) to designated isolation area • Nurse enacts plan to safely and quickly get student home • Student remains in isolation, under visual observation until picked up • Nurse quickly notifies the Director. • Director notifies the Regional Superintendent and other division representatives as needed. • Nurse and Director will contact the Local Health Departments (Lynchburg as well as the county the student is a resident of and institute any recommended procedures) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nurse accompanies sick student (wearing cloth face covering and maintaining 6 feet social distance) to designated isolation area • IF the student is well enough, nurse enacts plan to immediately send student home. If the student is displaying any of the emergency warning signs of COVID-19 (<i>shortness of breath, bluish lips, difficulty breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, inability to stay awake</i>), supervising adult immediately calls 911 • Nurse quickly notifies the Director. • Director notifies the Regional Superintendent and other division representatives as needed. • Nurse and Director will contact the Local Health Departments (Lynchburg as well as the county the student is a resident of and institute any recommended procedures)
